

Schools and students will lose the most

- The Mayor wants to cut \$641 million from our schools next year (amounting to \$2 billion in total cuts over four years)
 - Next year, **\$100 million of Fair Student Funding is being cut.**
 - **\$54 million cut from “Equity and Excellence for All” programs** that have been central to the highest-ever graduation and college enrollment rates, and has decreased school pushout (cuts will total \$216 million over four years)
 - **Axed the Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)**, and with it, 75,000 jobs that students were counting on having this summer.
- **A four-year hiring freeze** that would leave positions vacant when teachers and social workers retire.

The NYPD is protected and empowered

- That is compared to only \$23 million cut from the NYPD. **Cuts to education will be 2800% greater than cuts to policing.**
 - **Despite overall cuts, the NYPD is set to receive a \$5 million increase** from the preliminary figures released in January.
- The Mayor is dedicated to preserving and increasing one area of funding for schools next year: **one piece of the subcontract from DOE to NYPD is slated to increase by \$4 million** (totalling \$307 million).
- **The city will continue to hire police officers** and their headcount will slightly increase.

The Capital Plan: policing and surveillance infrastructure

Capital Plans are approved in five-year chunks and amended throughout that time. Funding for security infrastructure has not been affected by the health crisis in the plan's current draft.

- \$200 million for “Safety & Security.” **That's \$40 million a year (for five years) on security hardware such as brand new metal detectors and surveillance cameras in schools.**
 - Over \$7 million in security camera installation alone is currently in progress, with one school even being projected to spend \$630,000 on cameras.
 - The Capital Plan includes a note that the DOE will partner with the NYPD School Safety Division, but no budget breakdown of the purchases related to that partnership.
